FR BILL WRITES: Every second of everv day is a moment of infinite mercy. Everything we are and have is a demonstration of the loving mercy of the living God. Without God's mercy we would simply cease to exist. The great thing is that God can't help himself but show us his mercy, which is just as well, given our general ingratitude, presumption and fecklessness! St Paul knew this all too well; 'The good I should do, I do not; that which I should not, I do. Who can save us from this wretchedness? Thanks be to God through our Lord. Jesus Christ!' The mercy of the Father is made manifest in the person of his Son, Jesus, who willingly stretched out his arms between heaven and earth as the perfect sign of that mercy. If only we could see it! Instead, we enslave ourselves in our own distorted models of 'mercy' that blasphemously make of God a tyrant and our fellow human beings rivals to a finite pot of so-called justice. Pope Francis wants us to try to remember and understand what God's mercy really means. He has called an Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy to begin on Tuesday. Tuesday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The timing is deliberate: God's action in creating Mary free from Original Sin and its effects is the concrete beginning of the process that will make his mercy clear for the whole world to see on the cross. In his kindness, God had already prepared humanity for this through his Covenant with the Jewish people into which Mary, and so Jesus, would be born. God plays a long game! Mercy is a long game. The stakes, after all, could not be higher: the possibility of the eternal fulfilment of every single human person who
