## Faith into action

Today's Gospel opens with eight statements. Are they commandments? Suggestions? Warnings? Maybe numbers two through eight are actually a list of instructions for how to accomplish the first.

Jesus illustrates his instructions with metaphorical stories about servants and masters. He speaks of servants who can hardly wait for the householder to return; they linger at the door like kids waiting for Daddy to get home, pick them up and play with them. But what if he doesn't show up on time? There's something ominous about how the second and third watches of the night remind us of the Passion and the hours of Jesus' arrest and Peter's denial, when fear seemed to overwhelm hope.

Who among the disciples knew at what hour they would be put to the test? What kind of servants remain ready even when it seems the master may not return at all?

What Jesus asked of the disciples — to give away their goods, to be on the move, to be ready for what is coming rather than satisfied with what is — all of that was an invitation to put faith into action. He wanted them to act like they believed because that was the way to bring about the world they hoped to see.



This helps explain what Jesus says about what goes on behind closed doors when the master is out of town. Faithful servants act in the style of the master whether or not there is a security camera recording them. Their belief in the message continues to make the reign of God visible, even when they have nothing more than their hope that it will be fulfilled.

So, as we participate in our liturgy, instead of girt loins and sandals, let's don our metaphorical hiking boots and let our celebration launch us into the venture of faith that transforms hopes into reality.

Bishops' Conference has been asked to look into  
the possible resumption of the reception of Holy  
Communion under both kinds to the  
congregation. Having taken advice from  
Professor Jim McManus, it was thought that it  
would not be prudent to resume this at the  
moment, but that this would be kept under  
review as further research becomes available.

It was noted that most parishes are taking  
sensible options over the Sign of Peace. The  
shaking of hands have been replaced with  
nods. It was noted that clergy could decide for  
themselves if they wished to continue to wear  
face masks to distribute Holy Communion.

Jesus said to his disciples: *'Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them.*

*'And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.'*

**CONSULTATION** A public consultation has been launched into the possibility of imposing a Public Safety Protection Order (PSPO) around the BPAS abortion centre at Ophir Road, This would stop assistance and counselling being offered to mothers near the clinic and it would ban anyone from leafleting or praying in the vicinity. BCP options allow designated area(s) within the zone, but with so many restrictions as to make them virtually useless.
